Father Ted was born in Dublin Ireland in 1913, the only boy in a family of five children. He joined the Spiritan Order in 1932 and was ordained in 1940. Shortly thereafter he was assigned to serve in Kenya, joyfully laboring there for 30 years until expelled in 1971 over a matter of principle on which he would not yield.

He was reassigned to Canada. Whereas the word abortion did not exist in the language of Kenya, in Canada Father Ted found a modern nation embarking on a dubious experiment to liberalize abortion services. Father Ted joined the pro-life movement to try and educate the public, and especially his beloved young people, about the growing disrespect for human life and the evil and tragedy of abortion for all those involved and harmed by this practice.

Father Ted has devoted more than 30 years to life issues here in Canada as a prolific writer, compelling speaker, gentle teacher, committed activist, and raconteur par excellence. He has spoken to hundreds of thousands of people of all ages, at banquets, annual meetings, youth and retreat groups, and in classrooms. He has been arrested and jailed for his witnessing against the evil of abortion laws or lack thereof.

Most importantly, Father Ted has been a true disciple of the Lord, a friend to people, compassionate and highly principled. He deeply believes that prayer is the most important action of human beings in winning the right to life for unborn generations present and to come.

One of Father Ted's favourite quotations is from Edmund Burke: "All evil needs to flourish is that good men do nothing." The many good young people in our society are instead asked to do something.

His life of Christian service, dedication to the needs of others, largesse of spirit, moral convictions, and witnessing to truth are worthy of emulation.

This Scholarship Program is intended to celebrate his lifetime of service to God's human family and to inspire young people to learn more about the cause so dear to his heart.

# Nature and Purpose of the scholarship

The Father Ted Colleton Scholarship serves to encourage young people to learn about pro-life issues, the pro-life movement and to become actively involved in its programs.

## Value of scholarships

There are three prizes of \$1000.00 each awarded to three students annually, following a writing contest co-sponsored by *The Interim* newspaper and Niagara Region RTL.

## To be eligible for the scholarship candidates must

- be senior high school students (grade 11 or 12)
- submit one letter of reference, from a school staff member or community representative
- provide a brief self-profile outlining participation in school life/community activities and a description of their interest/involvement in the pro-life cause

## The contest rules

The student must submit a typed original essay, (approximately 800-1000 words in length) postmarked **no later than December 8, 2006** on the topic: *"Is abortion the most important human rights issue of our day?"*

## Administration of the scholarship program

The contest is administered by a committee selected by the staff of *The Interim*.

## Rights to essays submitted

Copyrights to any essay submitted for the purpose of the contest will be retained by *The Interim* newspaper. Any publication or other use of the work would be acknowledged by naming its author.

## Helpful hints

### for the essay writing component

- a) Take the necessary time to do proper research. Do not leave it to the last minute.
- b) Write with passion, commitment and clarity.
- c) Write from a personal stance, citing your own insights.
- d) Follow the best writing practices, include a strong introduction, a substantial body that develops your main thesis or point of view, and a ringing conclusion.
- e) Consider the essay as an article to be worthy of publication in a national newspaper.

This may sound formidable, but it can be done by following the advice outlined above

## Announcement of winning entry

Eligible essays will be assessed by the panel by January 15, 2007. The winners will be declared by February 1, 2007. Criteria for the selection of winners include the quality of essays submitted. Prior involvement in the pro-life movement does not disqualify the students from the scholarships.

Students related to employees or volunteers of *The Interim* or Campaign Life Coalition.

Students who have been employed by *The Interim* or Campaign Life Coalition.
